- Developed and implemented an iconic street sign identification project to improve the aesthetics of our streetscapes;

Village of Pinecrest MILESTONES



SEPTEMBER 20, 1994 More than 600 residents met at Palmetto Middle School to discuss the incorporation of Pinecrest as advocated by incorporation leaders Evelyn Langlieb Greer and Gary Matzner.



SEPTEMBER 19, 1995 Pinecrest-area voters choose city-hood (3,138 to 1,623) during a special election.

MARCH 12, 1996 Pinecrest voters adopted the Village Charter and the Village of Pinecrest become Miami-Dade County's 29th municipality.



MAY 1, 1996 Evelyn Langlieb Greer was sworn-in as the first mayor and Cindie Blanck, Barry Blaxberg, Leslie Bowe, and Robert Hingston were sworn-in as the members of the first Village Council at a ceremony held at Pinecrest Elementary School.



NOVEMBER 19, 1996 The Village Council adopted the Village Seal.

JULY 1, 1997 The Pinecrest Police Department, under the leadership of Police Chief Bruce W. Davis, becomes operational and assumed patrol responsibilities from the Metro-Dade County Police Department



FEBRUARY 9, 1999 The Village Council adopted the Village's first Comprehensive Development Master Plan.

JUNE 11, 1999

The Village Council dedicated the portion of South Dixie Highway (US 1) in Pinecrest as Pinecrest Parkway. The codesignation of the roadway was approved by the Florida Legislature and signed into law by former Pinecrest resident, Governor Jeb Bush.



JULY 6, 1999 The Pinecrest Parks and Recreation Division assumed responsibility for Coral Pine Park, Suniland Park and Veterans Wayside Park as ownership of these parks was transferred by Miami-Dade County to the Village.



NOVEMBER 27, 2000 The Village Council adopted the Village's Land Development Regulations and repealed Miami-Dade County's Zoning Code.

JANUARY 2002 The Village's contractor completed installation of the Village's new street signs – the program was designed to establish a means of promoting a community identity and knowledge of Village boundaries.

MARCH 8, 2003

The Village Council dedicated Pinecrest Gardens, at the former site of the historic Parrot Jungle and Gardens, and celebrated the Village's 7th Anniversary with a community celebration at the new municipal park.



JULY 31, 2004 The Pinecrest Police Department was awarded international accreditation by the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies (CALEA).

OCTOBER 26, 2004 The Village Council designated the Pinecrest Municipal Center as the official seat of government. The municipal center was dedicated four days later during a public ceremony and became the permanent home of the municipal government including Village Hall and the Police Department.

NOVEMBER 3, 2004 Mayor Greer administered

Mayor Greer administered the oath of office to the Village's second mayor -Gary C. Matzner.



NOVEMBER 9, 2004 The Village Council renamed Pinecrest Park as the "Evelyn Langlieb Greer Park" in recognition of the contributions and accomplishments of the Village's founding mayor.

MARCH 18, 2006 Over 2,000 residents joined the Village Council in celebrating the 10th Anniversary of the Village's founding with a concert, featuring KC and the Sunshine Band, and a firework's spectacular at Evelyn Greer Park.

MAY 31, 2008 The Village Council dedicated the new Pinecrest Community Center on the Pinecrest Gardens campus.

NOVEMBER 5, 2008 Cindy Lerner was sworn-in as the Village's third mayor after her election on November 4th



JANUARY 30, 2009 The Village Council unveiled

a sign commemorating the Village's national status as a Tree City USA community bestowed in recognition of Pinecrest's commitment to community forestry and the planting of over 10,000 trees since 1997.

JULY 2010 The Pinecrest Police Department was designated a Flagship Agency by the

Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies (CALEA) in recognition of the department's excellence in public safety standards.

MAY 11, 2011 The Village Council adopted Pinecrest's first Strategic Plan.



DECEMBER 6, 2011 At her fourth State of the Village address, Mayor Lerner announced that Pinecrest Gardens had been listed by the United States Department of the Interior on the National Register of Historic Places and, logether with members of the Village Council, unveiled a commemorative plaque memorializing the designation.

DECEMBER 2011

The South Florida Business Journal rated Pinecrest as "Best in South Florida for Qualify of Life" as a result of an analysis by The Business Journals which included a 20part rating formula based on strong economic indicators, housing stocks and effective educational systems.



JUNE 2012

The Village earned recognition from the national non-profit KaBOOHI as 2012 Playful City USA community for efforts to increase play opportunities for children – one of only 213 communities in the country to receive the designation. The Village is recognized with the award again in 2013 and 2015.

FEBRUARY 15, 2013 Cognac, France Mayor Michel Gourinchas and Mayor Lerner signed a twinning agreement, during a ceremony honoring Cognac at Pinecrest Gardens, establishing Pinecrest's first sister city relationship.

APRIL 14, 2014 The Village published the inaugural issue of the new quarterly magazine -The Pinecrest Sun.

FEBRUARY 22, 2016 The Village Council unveiled a marker at the former location of the Miami Serpentarium recognizing the historical significance of the former tourist attraction.

MARCH 12, 2016 The Village's 20th anniversary was commemorated with a time capsule ceremony at the Pinecrest Municipal Center.

OCTOBER 12, 2016 The Village Council broke ground on a \$5 million expansion project of the Pinecrest Community Center. The expanded new center was dedicated in 2018.



NOVEMBER 8, 2016 Joseph M. Corradino was elected, without opposition, as Pinecrest's fourth mayor becoming the first former member of the Village Council to serve in that position.

MARCH 17, 2017 The Village recognized the NFL's winningest coach and Miami icon, Don Shula, with a community event at Evelyn Greer Park.

MAY 31, 2017 The Village Council dedicated the new Tennis Center at Coral Pine Park.

AUGUST 12, 2017 Mayor Corradino delivered the first pitch at the Miami Marlins' game during Pinecrest Day at Marlins Park.

JANUARY 25, 2018 Over 300 residents participated in the Inspire Pinecrest citizen engagement initiative.

APRIL 27, 2018 Village officials, friends and family gathered to dedicate Leslie Bowe Hall at Evelyn Greer Park in honor of the founding councilmember who passed away in 2017.

DECEMBER 2018

During Miami Art Week, Killian Drive became "Elevation Drive" as part of a public art project by acclaimed artist Xavier Cortada.

MARCH 14, 2020

The Village Council conducted an emergency meeting in the Banyan Bowl, at Pinecrest Gardens, and directed the shutting down of most municipal facilities and activities due to the coronavirus pandemic.

NOVEMBER 20, 2020 The Village Council has its first female majority when Shannon del Prado joined Katie Abbott and Anna Hochkammer on the dais.

RESIDENTIAL CONSTRUCTION WHAT TO EXPECT

Whether you think of building permits as a checkpoint for public harmony or a bureaucratic nuisance, they are a vital part of the construction process. Official approval in the form of a building permit ensures that your real estate remains legal to sell, and complies with state minimum requirements for life safety.

Do you need to pull a permit for artificial turf?

Installation of artificial turf in the Village of Pinecrest requires a permit from the Building and Planning Department to confirm compliance with the Village's minimum greenspace requirements and stormwater management requirements.

Every property in Pinecrest requires preservation of a specified amount of "greenspace", defined as "a permeable area or areas open to the sky (except for roof overhangs up to three feet) including beautification strips, consisting of those materials such as, but not limited to hedges, trees, planted ground cover, grassed areas, planted floral installations, and dry retention areas, all of which must be composed of natural plantings only". Artificial turf is considered to be part of the developed hardscape and although it can be permitted, it is not considered natural area and can only be permitted on a property in instances where the required minimum amount of natural greenspace is otherwise preserved.

Failure to obtain a required permit prior to installation of artificial turf will result in an enforcement action against the property owner which may include fines, an order from the Special Magistrate to obtain permits, and an order to remove artificial turf and restore natural greenspace in an amount necessary to comply with the Village's minimum greenspace requirements.



Does your project need permits?

A building permit is official approval from the Village to proceed with a construction project. It shows that your plans comply with state and local building codes which meet minimum safety and construction standards dealing with land



use, zoning, and structural integrity, as well as sanitation, water, sewage, fire resistance and electricity. A permit proves compliance, rendering your home both legal and re-sellable.

Most remodeling and/or building construction projects that construct, enlarge, alter, repair, move, demolish and/or replace any electrical, gas, plumbing or mechanical systems require permits. Types of permit-required construction include anything that would be a change to the overall structure, electrical, plumbing, and mechanical enhancements such as air conditioners. Each can merit its own permit and series of inspections.

Qualified licensed State of Florida contractors know when and how to pull permits, and will take care of them for you. Typically, the person who pulls the permit is responsible for following construction codes.

When in doubt, contact the Village's Building and Planning Department to be sure if you need a permit for work you wish to have done on your property or not. You can call **305.234.2121** or email **building@pinecrest-fl.gov**.

When do you need a building permit?

A general building permit plus special system permits are required for projects such as:

- Artificial turf
- New construction
- Altering or adding to a house, garage, or driveway
- Major internal work (e.g., electrical, gas, plumbing)
 Kitchen remodel
 - Bathroom remodel
- Roof repairs or replacement
 - Structural changes, installing skylights, altering the shape or pitch
 - Replacing roofing materials with similar ones
- Deck and yard
- Retaining walls
- Fireplace and heating, ventilation and air conditioning (HVAC)
- Garage or shed
 - Enlarging, converting, or building garages or carports
 - Installation of new garage doors
- Installing floors and cabinets
- Installing new windows and doors
- Installing in-ground pools and spas
- Installing septic systems

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT

PINECREST GARDENS UPPER GARDEN PROJECT

The improvements to the upper garden area at Pinecrest Gardens will focus on accessibility compliance with the American with Disability Act (ADA), and include the following new features for the facility:

- ADA accessible playground, toddler space and supporting bathrooms
- Petting Zoo improvements that offer children of all abilities the opportunity to engage with our animals, and that provide our resident animals a healthy and safe environment during extreme weather
- Expanded Sensory Garden
- A new state-of-the-art Inspiration Center that will focus on all-inclusive activities
- Improved picnic area

Construction is beginning in February 2021 with a completion date of January 2022. A portion of the construction costs will be offset by a \$250,000 grant from the State of Florida. The Village Council has approved the issuance of a loan in the amount of \$4 million for this project.

PINECREST GARDENS LOWER GARDEN ADA PATHWAYS

This project consists of the replacement of the 26,504 square feet of trails throughout the lower garden area of the park in order to make them ADA accessible and address safety issues. This includes demolition of the existing trails, leveling the ground while protecting existing tree root structures to achieve a code compliant structural incline, and replacing the current path with a more durable material that provides safe mobility throughout the park. Construction is expected to begin in March 2021 with a completion date of May 2021. Construction cost is estimated at \$500,000, a portion of which will be offset by a \$200,000 grant from the State of Florida.

PINECREST GARDENS HIBISCUS GALLERY IMPROVEMENTS

Improvements to the Hibiscus Gallery at Pinecrest Gardens are underway. Aside from a new roof for that portion of the Main Entrance Building at Pinecrest Gardens, the Village will unveil the new improved space that will feature removal of the exposed A/C ducts, replacement of the clerestory windows and new terrazzo floors featuring an abstract hibiscus flower design. Project cost is \$204,128.

EVELYN GREER PARK PLAYGROUND RENOVATION

The playground will undergo a complete redesign. The improvements will feature brand new play structures, a new canopy structure and a new a poured-in-place surface. Project commencement has been extended to the fall of 2021 pending results from a Florida Recreation Development Assistance Program grant for improvements to Evelyn Greer Park. The grant is a matching grant of \$200,000 and will be used for playground renovations and other facility upgrades around the park. This project is expected to cost \$375,000.

EVELYN GREER PARK RESTROOM UPGRADES

The restrooms at Evelyn Greer Park are undergoing various upgrades which include new tile flooring, new hand dryers and new sinks. Project commencement has been extended to the fall of 2021 pending results from a Florida Recreation Development Assistance Program grant for improvements to Evelyn Greer Park. Project cost is \$34,000.



FLAGLER GROVE PARK IMPROVEMENTS

The new LED field lights, playground and shade structure at Flagler Grove Park have been completed. The new synthetic turf field and new shade structures over the bleachers are expected to be completed by fall of 2021. Project cost is \$1,250,000.

PINECREST GARDENS DIRECTIONAL SIGNAGE

The directional signage within Pinecrest Gardens is being renovated due to wear and tear, and updated to accommodate changes to the park since the signs were originally installed in 2004. Sign refinishing will take place throughout the spring of 2021. Project cost is \$8,465.





VILLAGE ENTRANCE FEATURE MONUMENT SIGNS CONSTRUCTION

The Village will be unveiling a new look for its entrance signs, starting with construction of a new sign at the intersection of Red Road and SW 120 Street. The entire project with a total cost of \$171,558, also includes installation of five more entrance signs at the following additional locations:

- Ludlam Road north of Kendall Drive
- Kendall Drive and Red Road
- Ludlam Road and SW 136 Street
- Pinecrest Parkway (US 1) and SW 136 Street
- Pinecrest Parkway (US 1) and Killian Drive



The Parks and Recreation Department manages the Pinecrest Community Center and all public parks in the Village including Coral Pine Park, Flagler Grove Park, Evelyn Greer Park, Red Road Linear Park, Suniland Park, Veterans Wayside Park and the Village Green.

When you arrive at Pinecrest Gardens, ask for a map at the ticket booth, and the On-Cell Tour instructions are included with the map. Each of the 32 stops on the tour provide a point to listen and learn, and will begin at the entry of the garden paths, just beyond the ticket booth. As you walk, you will see bright green rectangular signage with the stops indicated. Follow the signs as you go or skip to the stops that pique your interest.
