WELCOME TO PINECREST'S PUBLIC SCHOOLS

Pinecrest's strong property values are supported by the excellence of the Miami-Dade County Public Schools (MDCPS) located in our Village. I encourage our residents with school-age children to take a close look at our neighborhood public schools as you evaluate your many fine educational options. I did, and I found Pinecrest's public schools were the best choice for my children's education. They are the foundation of our community and truly offer excellence in our own backyard.

There are five public schools in Pinecrest - three elementary schools, a middle school and a high school. They are traditional neighborhood schools where children go to school with their friends and neighbors. Living a short drive or walk away from your school fosters play-dates, and participation in after-school clubs and sports. While our schools are known for their strong gifted programs and extensive advanced placement courses, there are academic options for all children, including special needs, so that all students can develop to their full potential.

Equally important, our five Pinecrest schools work carefully in tandem to maintain continuity of curriculum from elementary through high school. This is particularly useful in foreign languages and STEM/STEAM, where students can start early in an area of interest and follow it through graduation. At the same time, they are not restricted to the rigid curriculum constraints of magnet schools. Our students are free to explore a myriad of electives including performing and visual arts, music, business/ entrepreneurship, technology, environmental and other sciences, new and traditional media and more. A full range of clubs, honor societies and teams complement classroom subjects for children to follow their passions or discover new ones.

Village students regularly compete in – and win – academic, arts, and sports competitions, locally and nationally, starting in the elementary schools. Field trip opportunities abound, including international experiences.

Strong parental involvement enriches our schools with impressive additional resources. The five PTA/PTSAs collectively raise nearly \$1 million annually, and contribute thousands of volunteer hours that substantially augment services, staffing and programming. The Village provides additional layers of support via a \$10,000 yearly grant to each school's PTSA, an Educational Advisory Council that meets regularly to bring parents, principals and school district representatives together, and an educational compact with the MDCPS district to facilitate creative approaches to working together.

Stay Close, Go Far is more than a slogan. Palmetto Senior High School's stellar college placements and storied alumni provide proof positive that Pinecrest's public schools are an outstanding choice.



PROGRAMDESCRIPTIONS

Cambridge Primary Program: Program offers elementary students academic rigor in English, Mathematics and Science and a global focus that promotes cultural sensitivity with a flexible curriculum encouraging critical thinking skills. (Howard Drive Elementary, Palmetto Elementary)

Cambridge Academy: Focusing on mathematics, science and language arts, the Cambridge Secondary 1 curriculum follows a rigorous approach to inquiry-based learning. The strategies, skills and rigor of the Secondary 1 program is fundamental in preparing students for Advanced Placement courses in high school. (Palmetto Middle School)

Challenge (Gifted) Program: Students that meet intellectually gifted criteria are eligible for an academically accelerated language arts, mathematics, science and/or social studies program. (All five schools)

Extended Foreign Language Program (EFL): Program offers dual language (English and Spanish) education. (Howard Drive Elementary, Palmetto Elementary, Pinecrest Elementary)

Forensic Science Academy: Students explore different modalities of forensic investigation through hands-on experiences as they relate to the application of scientific studies and physical evidence. (Palmetto Middle School and Miami Palmetto High School)

Special Education Program (SPED): Both the inclusion model and resource model are offered in Grades K-5. The delivery model is decided based upon the students' needs as determined by their Individualized Education Plan. (All five schools)

- LEAP Learning Experiences: Alternative half-day Pre-K program for students with autism. (Palmetto Elementary)
- PreK Inclusion Program: Ages 3-5, Full day program with equal number of children with an IEP and typical developing peers. (Howard Drive Elementary)
- Role Model Program: A full-day Pre-K program for children with varying disabilities. (Palmetto Elementary)
- Students with Emotional/Behavioral Disabilities Program (E/BD): Program designed to provide the support students require to access their education. All M-DCPS E/BD programs strive to address the diverse needs of the students, utilizing individualized approaches, instructional, therapeutic, and behavioral realms into cohesive educational programs. (Howard Drive Elementary)

STEAM Designation: Program focuses on Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Math taught through cooperative, collaborative, creative lessons that promote academic rigor and emphasize critical thinking skills with inquiry-based learning. (Howard Drive Elementary, Palmetto Elementary, Pinecrest Elementary and Palmetto Middle)

World Language Program: Students are presented opportunities to listen, speak, read and write in various languages including Spanish (all schools), French (Miami Palmetto Senior, Palmetto Middle), Mandarin Chinese (Miami Palmetto Senior, Palmetto Middle, Pinecrest Elementary), Italian (Miami Palmetto Senior), and Japanese (Miami Palmetto Senior)


