ON THE COVER



The Pinecrest Gardens Upper Gardens Project is complete and open the public. The Upper Garden Improvement Conceptual Master Plan, commissioned by the Village Council in 2019, provided the vision for future facility enhancements that improve program access and make Pinecrest Gardens a world-class facility. I am proud to say that the Village has delivered this and more. The joy and education opportunities the Upper Gardens

will bring to everyone - irrespective of ability—is priceless and is one-of-a-kind in the South Miami-Dade region.

MANAGER'S MESSAGE

The budgeting process for the Fiscal Year 2022-23 is well underway and September will provide two opportunities for the Village Council to consider the proposed budget during public hearings that will take place on September 13 and 22 at 6 p.m. While experiencing the effects of higher costs of doing business due to supply chain shortages and turbulence overseas, the proposed budget keeps a steadfast focus on Pinecrest's core mission.

The proposed Fiscal Year 2022-23 Budget and Capital Improvement Program establishes an action plan that provides the most effective and efficient use of available resources necessary to achieve the short and long-term aspirations of the Village Council, as identified in the Village Council's Strategic Plan. The recommended budget, which proposes a millage rate of 2.35 mils per \$1,000 of taxable value, observes a fiscally conservative approach, considering the financial impacts of an expected mild recession. It also facilitates a proactive stance to maximize on opportunities that have manifested due the above-mentioned economic hardships.

This has been a banner year in funding for the Village. In fact, the amount of funding the Village received this year is more than all years, cumulatively. This year, the Village has received approximately \$10M from the state and federal government and has benefited from

the Florida Power & Light pilot program which undergrounds 50 miles of powerlines by the end of 2022. The Village retains its triple-A bond rating, the highest possible standard achievable by a bond issuer. This rating confirms Pinecrest's financial strength and its ability to make interest payments and repay the principal of bonds when due.

CAR SAFETY

The safety of our residents is a top priority. A significant portion of our public safety mission is accomplished through positive community interactions, crime prevention tactics, and effective policing.

Overall crime in the Village remains at some of the lowest levels in our history but that does not mean we are immune to crime. Vehicle thefts remain an issue for the South Florida region, and we still get the occasional opportunistic criminals looking for easy targets.

Criminals steal cars for a few reasons. Stolen cars are often used to commit other crimes. They can also be sold for parts. In South Florida, stolen cars are also shipped off and sold overseas. Stolen cars can be used for a joy ride and later abandoned. In all cases, the car owner feels angry, vulnerable, frustrated, and/or afraid. Car owners can minimize the likelihood of being taken advantage of by employing easy prevention measures.

The most common reason cars are stolen is because they are left unlocked, with the key fob left in the vehicle. Common sense crime prevention tips offer proven and cost-effective methods to deter criminal activity. The Police Department and thousands of agencies across the country remind everyone to be vigilant, lock their doors, remove the key fob, and secure their belongings wherever they go. We encourage residents to put these tips into practice.

SEE SOMETHING, SAY SOMETHING

We encourage residents to contact police anytime they see anything suspicious or if they have been the victim of a crime. Please do not hesitate to contact us. The more police learn from residents, the better prepared we are to address issues. Residents should use the non-emergency number to report suspicious activity at 305.234.2100. Always dial 911, during an emergency.

PUBLIC SAFETY

Police operations are planned to promote public safety. Our officers interact with the community daily while conducting watch orders, park details, and park and walks throughout the Village. Police also use traffic enforcement to increase public safety. Other tactics include deploying police speed detection trailers and police cruisers at strategic locations to increase perceived police presence. In addition to regular police duties, the Community Resource Team (CRT) works closely with residents and local

NEWS & NOTES

SWALE 101

The swale, in Public Works speak is the grassed area between a private property line and the edge of the pavement of the adjacent road. The dictionary defines a swale as a low-lying or depressed, and often wet stretch of land. The generally accepted engineering definition is a shallow channel with gently sloping sides. A swale may be either natural or man-made. Artificial swales are often infiltration basins, designed to manage water runoff, filter pollutants, and increase rainwater infiltration.

Top three things to know as a Village resident:

- The maintenance of the swale is the responsibility of the abutting property owner
- Reflectors also known as "lollipops" are not permitted in swale area
- Only sod and street trees are permitted in the swale. Find out more about the Village's Street Tree program at www.pinecrest-fl.gov/trees.

You can help the environment by maintaining your swale. Mow the swale regularly. Remove and compost leaves and grass clippings, and do not use fertilizers, pesticides, or herbicides as required by Village code. Refrain from piling garbage, trash, leaves, limbs, or garden debris in swales as this adds pollutants which can wash into downstream waters—and eventually, Biscayne Bay. There's no good reason to irrigate a swale. If constructed properly, a swale is a naturally moist area in no need of additional water. Similar to the Everglades, it does not need irrigation.

Swales serve as the primary drainage system for most Village roads. They retain, detain, or convey runoff generated by the adjacent roadway and overflow from adjacent properties. Swales often have inlets that collect more runoff that is sent to a French drain or to be discharged into a nearby canal or lake. Swales remove sediments, nutrients, and pollutants from runoff, which improves the quality of ground water and surface waters.

Swales also play a role in transportation. They provide a safe multi-modal location for pedestrians and cyclists by providing an area for sidewalks or shared-use paths. Swales provide a location to install traffic signals, light poles, and traffic-related signage. Swales are used to locate public utilities, both above ground and below ground. Examples include drainage, water, sewer, gas, electric, and communications—both fiber optic and cable. Swales also provide space to place and store debris for pick up after a natural disaster.

TREE TRIMMING GUIDELINES

One of most beautiful characteristics of the Village is its verdant canopy. Tree trimming is a serious topic in Pinecrest and if not done correctly, it can cause the property owner to incur hefty fines that start at \$500 and can go up to \$3,000 per tree – due to tree topping. The most common reason given for topping is to reduce the size of a tree. Homeowners may feel that their trees have become too large for their property, or fear that tall trees may pose a hazard. Topping, in fact, will make a tree more hazardous in the long run. This is why the Village requires property owners to hire a licensed arborist to correctly prune a tree.

A licensed arborist will know how to:

- Remove deadwood and twigs
- Identify cracks and decay that weaken a tree's structure
- Remove codominant branches with included bark that may become a point of failure during a storm event
- Create an open an airy canopy to allow wind to blow through

Pinecrest has an in-house licensed arborist, who can provide guidance when trimming trees on your property. Call or email the Public Works Department at 305.669.6916 or **publicworks@pinecrest-fl.gov** to find out more. Once tree trimming is completed, please call 311 for debris pickup. Debris that is not picked up is unsightly and can become dangerous in a wind event.





CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT RUNDOWN



EVELYN GREER PARK PLAYGROUND IMPROVEMENTS

The new ADA-accessible playground at Evelyn Greer Park is in its final construction phase. Upgrades to the playground include an enhanced poured-in-place safety surface, new shade sails, play structures for children 2 to 5 and 5 to 12, and multiple interactive ground components. The new design features Landscape Structures' Hedra Model, which combines unique geometric configurations and continuous circuits to create a hive of evolving play that encourages exploration and imagination, while building upon each child's strength, confidence, and social development. The new playground is scheduled to open at the beginning of October.

POTABLE WATER PROJECT

The Village was awarded funding from the American Rescue Plan in early 2021 for the Village's potable water project. This project will provide access to potable water to nearly 750 properties. Since construction started on January 3 of this year, more than half of the 100,000 linear feet of new water mains have been installed, along with the associated laterals and fire hydrants. Before residents can enjoy the fresh new potable water, the new water lines must be flushed, pressure tested, and verified to be clear of bacteria. The affected roads will be milled and resurfaced, swales will be graded and re-sodded, and the Miami-Dade County Water and Sewer Department (WASD) will review the as-built drawings before the new system can be passed on to it for operation. As the work progresses, residents will be alerted to the construction and asked to provide their preferred location for the new meter. Consulting with a plumber to help determine this location is advised. Residents are encouraged to check the Village website for updates at www.pinecrest-fl.gov/water.

PILE REST GARDENS



inecrest Gardens, South Florida's Cultural Arts Park, is a premier venue for visual and performing arts, education, environmental conservation, and preservation. On any given day one can attend a concert or play, visit the Hibiscus Gallery, tour the 12-acres of native forested wetland, tropical hardwood hammock and native cypress slough, or take a class in art or horticulture. ART IN THE GARDEN

ARTIST-IN-RESIDENCE XAVIER CORTADA

Xavier Cortada, Miami's pioneer eco-artist, serves as artist-in-residence at Pinecrest Gardens, where his studio, gallery, and social practice is based. From polar glaciers to Arctic sea ice—from streaming brooks to open bays—Cortada frequently uses water as a medium to convey its incredible importance, warn about the grave danger it poses to coastal communities, and engage others in its conservation.



The Art of Diatoms

Diatoms are water-bound, single-celled microalgae encapsulated in silica. They harness the power of the sun to convert carbon dioxide into oxygen and are responsible for generating at least one-fifth of the oxygen we breathe. Diatoms also allow scientists to see into the Earth's past: by examining the glass shells of diatoms that are preserved in sedimentary core samples, scientists can determine the past salinity of water as well as the current state of its degradation.

Artist's statement

"Diatoms transport me to a place so distant in time that it wouldn't look like the Earth I know. They help connect me to an Earth I am trying to better understand. An Earth fluid. An Earth as process. An Earth completely interconnected. An Earth generating life forms across space and time. The presence of diatoms in layered sediment connects us to the ecosystem in which they thrived while they were alive. Indeed, they are a portal to what once was so that we can better learn how to protect what now is."
