MAYOR'S MESSAGE

Responsive government is a pillar of how the Village does business both in recreation and in more pressing matters such as bringing potable water to all Pinecrest residents and hardening powerlines.

Dedicated pickleball courts and the design for Gary Matzner Park are two recent initiatives that were informed by resident input. Pickleball Courts at Coral Pine Park were open for play in April and the design for Gary Matzner Park was approved during the May Village Council meeting.

Matzner Park will feature walking paths, a shelter with restrooms, a playground, open green spaces and areas to display native plantings. There will be 15 spaces for parking with access to 67th Avenue. The Village's dedication to create more green space and a larger canopy was noticed by the Arbor Day foundation, which awarded Pinecrest the Tree City 2022 Growth Award for continuous efforts to improve our urban forestry program and protecting our tree canopy.

Most recently, the Village was recognized as the top place to live in South Florida by Niche, and just last year the Pinecrest Farmers Market was voted Best Farmers Market by the Miami New



CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT RUNDOWN



POTABLE WATER PROJECT

The Village of Pinecrest Waterline Extension Project addresses the water needs of approximately 725 well-dependent homes. The project consists of the installation of 8-,12-, & 16-inch water mains and extending new service lines from the water main to the lot lines, in accordance with Miami-Dade County Water and Sewer Department (WASD) standards. It also includes fire hydrants to provide fire protection.

Pinecrest received about \$8.1 million from the American Rescue Plan legislation, and the county has committed \$500,000 to the project. The balance of the project will be paid by the benefitting property owners with a special assessment of approximately \$358 per year for 25 years. Property owners will have up to 10 years to connect to the system. KENDALL DRIVE SHARED-USE PATH

As one of the adopted projects of the Village's Transportation Master Plan approved in 2018, the Kendall Drive Shared-Use Path project will connect SW 67 Avenue to Red Road. The project consists of removing the existing 5-foot wide concrete sidewalk and constructing an 8-foot asphalt path designed to accommodate two-way pedestrian and bicycle traffic. The path will be located entirely on the south side of Kendall Drive, with some of the new street trees located on the north side. In November 2021, Village Council approved commencement of the construction design which is expected to be completed in spring 2023. 


67TH AVENUE SHARED USE PATH

Shared-use paths are paved facilities physically separated from motorized vehicular traffic by an open space or barrier. They are used by bicyclists, pedestrians, runners, skaters, etc. As one of the adopted projects of the Village's Transportation Master Plan approved in 2018, the 67th Avenue Shared-Use Path will run from Snapper Creek to SW 136th Street. Village Council authorized the design of the path, however construction is pending until a funding source is identified.

CORAL PINE PARK PHASE 2

In 2014, Village Council adopted the Coral Pine Park Master Plan and divided the construction of the approved improvements into two phases. Phase 1, which included a new tennis center and playground, was completed in 2016. This project is for the design of Phase 2 which includes a new 900 square foot multi-purpose room. The design and construction documents are in its final stages and are expected to be completed by July 2023. Once the construction documents are completed, a bid will be advertised for the construction. This project is expected to be completed in February 2024.







In 2021, Village Council approved the acquisition of the 3.76 acre two-parcel site located on the southeast corner of Kendall Drive between 67 Avenue and 65 Court. This site is slated to become the future Gary Matzner Park. On June 8, 2022, Village Council awarded the contract to MKSK Inc for conceptual designs. An initial conceptual design was presented at the November 2022 Village Council meeting. The final conceptual design was presented in May 2023. The Village will advertise for a design/build firm to produce construction documents and build the park. For more information, please visit www.garymatznerpark.com.

EVELYN GREER PARK BATHROOM UPGRADES

The bathrooms at Evelyn Greer Park are undergoing various upgrades which include new flooring, new hand dryers and new sinks. This project is scheduled to take place during summer 2023.

SUNILAND PARK IMPROVEMENTS

Suniland Park will have several improvements during the 2022-23 fiscal year. These include LED lights for the athletic fields, a golf cage, and landscape beautification. The expected completion date is fall 2023.

FLAGLER GROVE PARK STORAGE FACILITY

A new storage facility will be built at Flagler Grove Park during the 2022-23 fiscal year. Award of the construction bid will be in May 2023 with construction taking place during the summer.

















PINECREST GARDENS CYPRESS HALL BALCONY

A new terrace and balcony will be constructed by February 2024 outside of Cypress Hall in Pinecrest Gardens. It is currently in the design phase, which is expected to be completed by the end of May 2023. The 835 square foot decking will be made from ecofriendly and recycled materials.

SW 136 STREET TRAFFIC CIRCLES

In an effort to improve roadway capacity and operations in the area, Miami-Dade County is making enhancements along Old Cutler Road. This includes new roundabouts with sidewalks, curb and gutters, a storm drainage system, irrigation, pavement markings and signage, and roadway lighting along Old Cutler Road at the intersections of SW 67 Avenue and SW 136 Street. Construction is currently underway. Drainage structures are being installed and once that is completed, the work is expected to move forward quicker with the construction of the roundabout.

The objective of the project is to provide safety and operational improvements to help traffic flow smoothly at the subject intersections and along the entire roadway network of Old Cutler Road. VILLAGE-WIDE TRANSPORTATION MASTER PLAN

In 2018, the Village Council adopted a Transportation Master Plan in an effort to enhance mobility and to provide traffic calming Village-wide. The plan is being implemented as a long-range capital projects program which includes traffic calming initiatives, sidewalk improvements, traffic operational improvements and an on-demand free electric car service. Traffic calming initiatives include speed tables, speed jumps, traffic circles, and diverters. A total of \$292,200 is budgeted for FY2023.

STORMWATER MASTER PLAN IMPLEMENTATION

The Public Works Department is working on localized drainage projects based on the results of the Village-wide Stormwater Master Plan (SMP) adopted by Village Council in 2015. Project priority is provided to areas which have repetitive standing water after storm events. The goal of this program is to eliminate those areas and improve the water quality of runoff discharging to canals and closed (French Drain) systems. More than 200 new storm drains have been installed since the completion of the master plan The ongoing improvements are constructed based on priority and funding

The 2022-23 SMP project is the Palmetto Island Drainage Project. It began in January 2023 and is expected to be completed by mid-July. This project lies in Basin U32-S and ranks 13th in priority on the SMP list. This basin was selected for design and construction based on the funding level of a grant that was made available to the Village by the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP). Additionally, there are five basins under design. The Village recently applied for a FEMA grant that would allow all five of these projects to be constructed. Status of the grant award is still pending, but the Village's application met all of the criteria of the grant.

CRIME PREVENTION TIP SECURE YOUR PROPERTY, REMEMBER THE 9 PM ROUTINE

There has been an increase in auto thefts in Pinecrest this year due to residents leaving their cars unlocked or their keys in the car. To avoid becoming a victim of auto theft, please remember to take the following steps to secure your property each night:

- 1. Remove any valuables from your vehicle.
- 2. Remove your key fob from your vehicle & lock your doors.
- 3. Lock your home doors and windows.
- 4. Turn your security alarm system on.
- 5. Turn on your outside lights.

By following this routine, you can sleep peacefully knowing that you've taken steps to protect your property. Suggestion: Set a daily alarm on your phone or post on your fridge as a reminder. PROFESSIONAL STAFF PROFILE VICTIM SERVICE COORDINATOR

The Police Department handles thousands of calls for service each year. Some calls involve victimized persons of domestic violence, theft, and burglary, to name a few. Often, these individuals require additional assistance beyond the initial call in the days, weeks, and sometimes months following the incident. Victims who need an advocate to assist them and their families during this time may reach out to our Victim Services Coordinator (VSC), Leah Vivancos, who has excelled in this role for nearly a decade and has done so with love and compassion.

Before serving as the Village's VSC, Leah Vivancos worked as a Dispatcher for five years and then as a Records Clerk for another five years. She assisted countless residents during that time. She understands that victims need additional support and guidance after the initial police response. Her motivation to become a victim advocate was also personal. When asked. she cited some of her personal experiences dealing with trauma, long-term health concerns, and the unexpected loss of loved ones as her reasons for serving. As the VSC, she hopes to support victims of crimes, reduce their stress, and encourage victims' cooperation.

Leah reviews all case reports and reaches out to victims to let them know she's ready to help. When requested, she meets with individuals and examines what they can expect next in the legal process. She assists with injunctions for protection orders and referrals to emergency shelters. A big part of her job involves providing emotional support as needed. When asked about her most significant victories at work, she paused for a moment before replying, "My biggest victories are those I can't talk about." Her response was a reminder of how sensitive and impactful her work truly is.







SPOTLIGHT ON GARDEN WILD LIFE

DID YOU KNOW PINECREST GARDENS IS HOME TO MOUNTAIN MULLET?

Mountain Mullet, Agonostomus monticola, is a moderately small fish species that is found in the Caribbean Basin, Central and northern South America, and the Southeastern U.S. Unusual for mullet, adult individuals spend their lives in freshwater, where they spawn. It's thought that newly-hatched larvae are carried out to sea, but soon return as juveniles. The young Mullet frequently swim to the headwaters of rivers and streams.

Mountain Mullet prefer freshwater habitats that are free-flowing, without channelization, dams, or other alterations. They are found where water is clear, typically with trees growing along the banks to provide some shady canopy.

Although the species is fairly common in the more tropical parts of its range, it seems sensitive to habitat conditions. In South Florida, land of slow-moving swamp waters, all natural coastal rivers, streams, and springs either have sustained profound flow and water-quality changes or have been completely eliminated. Mountain Mullet were formerly seen at the former Parrot Jungle, now Pinecrest Gardens. The population disappeared, but after efforts by the Village, have abundantly recolonized the single known site of the species' recent occurrence, the Lower Garden ponds at Pinecrest Gardens, which maintains essential habitat for the species. Look for schools of bullet-shaped, active fish of all ages and sizes up to about a foot in length.

PINECREST COMPOSTING PROGRAM

DID YOU KNOW THAT HUGE AMOUNTS OF GREENHOUSE GASES ARE PRODUCED BY FOOD WASTE IN LANDFILLS?

Instead of throwing out your food waste, compost it.

Help reduce greenhouse emissions by participating in the Village's Composting Program.

Residents can participate in 3 easy steps:

- 1. Save your food waste.
- 2. Drop off food waste at the composting bins located on the west side of the Pinecrest Gardens parking lot by the driveway next to the cottage.
- 3. Repeat.

COMPOSTABLE

Individuals can compost all food, soiled paper, and cardboard. Items for composting include fruits, veggies, prepared foods, meats, cheeses, dairy and bones.

NON-COMPOSTABLE

Items not eligible for composting are food service items that include molded fiber plates and bowls, bioplastics, flowers, metals, and plastics.
